The Public Servants Association (PSA) said one of its shop stewards was suspended after raising concerns about safety matters there. Staff members have complained of ageing infrastructure and non-functional elevators in the 15-storey building that are reportedly affecting patient care. Patients and workers have to take the stairs as only one elevator is operational -- a problem ongoing since 2015. The union said no reasons for the suspension was supplied to them. A manager at PSA KwaZulu-Natal, Mlungisi Ndlovu, said "if they decide to continue to intimidate our staff we will follow all the legal processes in terms of dispute process." Source eNCA Related
