Public servants head to court to enforce salary increase Written by POWER Digital on 11 May 2020 20:51 The Public Service Association (PSA) intends to take public service and administration minister Senzo Mchunu to court in a bid to enforce salary increases. In terms of the 2018 agreement, public servants were due to receive wage increases between 4.4% and 5.4% from April 1. CCMA will reopen to attend to Covid-19 jobs bloodbath This despite the government's compromised focus compounded by a sub-investment credit rating as well as the burden of the Covid-19 pandemic. Speaking to Thabiso Tema on POWER Drive on Monday, PSA assistant general manager Reuben Maleka says unions approached the Public Service Co-ordinating Bargaining Council (PSCBC) to no resolution. "Unfortunately, in the past I think two weeks we were playing marbles because nothing happened." He says the government made an unsatisfactory offer to the public servants. SA confirms 637 new Covid-19 cases "We are aware that the employer gave I think 1% or 2% [wage increase offer] to say to them [public servants] they must accept it. "So that tells you that it is not going to help to go to the PSCBC and try to renegotiate any resolutions. This is the time that we must enforce it." Compiled by Vukile Dlwati..
