Feedback: DESTEA Departmental Task Team meeting

A meeting convened to discuss President Ramaphosa's directive on transferring Environmental Affairs from the Free State Department of Economic, Small Business Development, Tourism and Environmental Affairs (DESTEA) to the Free State Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (DARD) and the implications for employees.

Transfer of employees

The employer reported that approximately 300 employees from DESTEA's Program 2 (Environmental Affairs) would undergo lateral transfer to the DARD. It further assured that no job losses were anticipated, and all employees would retain their current benefits during the transition.

Financial arrangements

DESTEA confirmed that all Performance Development Management Systems (PDMS) payments will be disbursed prior to the transfer. Leave and bursary arrangements will also be transferred to the DARD as part of this process.

Establishment of task team

A dedicated task team, comprising management representatives from both DESTEA and DARD, has been formed to oversee the transition. Mr Masilo Ntjoboko (DESTEA) and Mr Neo Mathlatsane (DARD) will represent the PSA on this team.

Process status

The employer previously reported that the initial stages of the transfer process have commenced, and the new structure involve DESTEA and Agriculture. The employer highlighted the need for registration with the Department of Public Service and Administration (DPSA), pending necessary approvals and directives.
