Feedback: Provincial Macro Organising of Governance (PMOG) – Gauteng Government restructuring of departments

Coordinating Chamber Province for Gauteng Province (CCPGP) meeting

On 14 February 2025, a special CCPGP meeting was held where the terms of reference proposed by the employer were presented. The employer called off the migration of the Charlotte Maxeke facility maintenance component of the Department of Infrastructure Development (DID) to the Department of Health. This included the migration of the Public Transport Inspectorate Unit from the Department of Community Safety to the Department of Roads and Transport. One of the discussions at the meeting on 14 February 2025 was in relation to the planned splitting of the Department of Agriculture and Rural Development into a new Department of Environment, as well as the migration of Gauteng Infrastructure Financing Agency from Treasury to DID. The PSA robustly argued that the Department of Agriculture and Rural Development being split into a new Department of Environment as well as the migration of the Gauteng Infrastructure Financing Agency from Treasury to DID should be referred to the General Public Service Sectoral Bargaining Council (GPSSBC) Provincial Chamber for development of terms of reference and modalities, for all affected departments. The employer collapsed the meeting as it could not agree to the sound and lawful proposals by the PSA.

Member of Executive Council (MEC) meeting with provincial labour

On 17 February 2025, MEC Jacob Mamabolo convened a second meeting with labour on behalf of Premier, Panyaza Lesufi, to further discuss the challenges regarding PMOG. After the PSA argued, the MEC instructed the employer representatives to request a special GPSSBC Chamber meeting and submit PMOG as an agenda item for discussion, along with the discussion on PMOG terms of reference. It was proposed that the PMOG must also include the restructuring of the Department of Economic Development. The PSA has provided the employer with a suitable earliest date for a special GPSSBC Chamber meeting. PSA will update members regarding this matter following the special GPSSBC Chamber meeting.
